I. God's Institution of Marriage (Gen. 1 & 2) A. Creation or Evolution; what difference does it make (Gen. 1)?

Genesis 1:20-31 (KJV)

[**Day 5**] And God said, Let the waters bring forth abundantly the moving creature that hath life, and fowl that may fly above the earth in the open firmament of heaven. ²¹And God created great whales, and every living creature that moveth, which the waters brought forth abundantly, after their kind, and every winged fowl after his kind: and God saw that it was good. ²²And God blessed them, saying, Be fruitful, and multiply, and fill the waters in the seas, and let fowl multiply in the earth. ²³And the evening and the morning were the fifth day.

- 1. Literal truth.
- 2. Evolution is true (Science better informer) so this is a myth.
- 3. Theistic Evolution (Both evolution and the Bible are correct).

Option 3 is impossible.

- A. In evolution on kind does not always produce the same kind.
- B. In evolution days 1 & 3 must follow day 4.
- C. Gen. 1's definition of 'day' is 'evening and morning.'
- D. The species do not develop through death but by creation.
- E. So accepting evolution one must take Genesis 1 as a myth, untrue.
- F. Lutheran interpretation: Scripture is literal unless it cannot be.
- G. If this is a myth, non literal, then all of Scriptures are equally so.
